Welcome to the 2025 Mitchell Optimist Music Festival...a community tradition since 1947. Our community music festival is open to young people up to and including secondary students enrolled in the school year of the 2025 festival. <u>Adults are welcome to take part in the non-competitive</u> <u>session for adult/cross generational participation</u>.

The Mitchell Optimist Music Festival Community promotes a gentle Music Festival competition and performance experience in which the talents of each child are celebrated and enhanced. The family, the music teacher(s) and the appraiser(s) act in unison in supporting the child's positive growth in musical skills, enjoyment of and appreciation for music. This mutual nurturing covers all aspects of the child's participation in the Mitchell Optimist Music Festival. It is not about winning, but rather it's about the nurturing of a life-long appreciation for the value of music as the universal language of humanity. While our music festival is, for some participants, a stepping stone to higher levels of competition elsewhere, it is first and foremost promoted as an annual community tradition – 78 years and counting - that celebrates the musical talents of our young people. Awards are presented but are not our priority.

This year we are introducing other forms of dance besides step dancing and are recognizing the 100 years of Grand Ole Opry music. For generations, Opry music has been played by family, friends and neighbours in kitchens and living rooms across our country, while others danced the night away. Many kitchen tables were the stage for guitar and fiddle players and if the host family were lucky enough to have a piano, that was an added delight.

We'd love to help you with the various classes, and let you know about the traditional routines of our music festival. You'll be glad you came! If you are one of our hundreds of returning participants, welcome to another year of music, community spirit and renewed friendships. We're glad you are taking part. RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR WORKSHOP/READINESS CLASSES (non-competitive)

Workshop/Readiness class is open to any participants (vocal or instrumental) including adults who wish expert advice from the adjudicator. Because of the increased time allotment, this class has a specific fee.

- 1. In general, 20 minutes is allotted for each entry.
- 2. Allotted time includes your performance and the adjudicator's 'teaching'.
- 3. Each participant brings music to perform (whole or in part) keeping in mind your total allotted time of 20 minutes.
- 4. Participants are encouraged to provide the adjudicator with their music, bars numbered.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR STEP DANCING

Please Note: age of participant is determined by age on the day of the step dancing session for the current year's music festival. Our festival is a relaxed environment. Audience coaching is permitted.

- 1. In Class SD-1 (Step Dancing 6 & under reel), participants may choose to have someone else with them. Adjudication is given only to the registered participant.
- 2. All participants need to provide the desk with their prepared music to be used with the in-house music unit.
- 3. Participants in the open class must dance a clog, jig, reel, in that order without stopping.
- 4. Solo participants 12 and under are required to dance a reel only.
- 5. Solo participants are encouraged complete their dance within four (4) minutes.
- 6. Each participant may enter one solo class and be part of one Group. (Demonstration class excluded)
- 7. Group Dancing will consist of three (3) to five (5) dancers and are encouraged complete their dance within five (5) minutes. NB: Group name is needed.
- 8. Participants in group dancing may use any step dancing routine.
- 9. To qualify as an 8 and under group the <u>average age</u> must be under 9 years. (Divide total ages of dancers by the number of dancers in the group (8.7 or 8.8 years, etc. is considered as 8 and under)).
- 10. To qualify as a junior group the <u>average age</u> must be under 13 years. (Divide total ages of dancers by the number of dancers in the group [12.7 or 12.8 years, etc. is considered as 13 and under]).
- 11. Due to Canada's Privacy laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.

12. Please provide your own music. A microphone is available. No other sound equipment is provided by the festival.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PIANO CLASSES

Please note: Own choice for duet and trio classes.

- 1. All test pieces <u>must</u> be memorized, except for piano duets, trios, pop solos and quick study. Failure to do so, in competitive classes, will result in the participant being adjudicated, but not receiving a mark.
- 2. All decisions of the adjudicator are final and should not be questioned.
- 3. Participants may not compete in the same solo class for two successive years. <u>This is permissible</u> in duet, trio, Gr. 9, 10 and open classes, but only for two years.
- 4. Participants may compete only once in the duet and trio sections.
- 5. N.B. In own choice classes, participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music or proof of electronic purchase before that particular class.
- 6. If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of the envelope, place music inside and have ready for presentation to adjudicator.
- 7. Please number bars for the adjudicator.
- 8. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 9. Except for the Adult/Cross Generational classes, a participant can only enter once in any one class.

- 11. QUICK STUDY PICK UP: Participant needs to be registered in at least one other piano class. Participant needs to pick up music from the adjudicator the day before scheduled class or make arrangements for music to be emailed. Participant is expected to learn the selection independently.
- 12. OWN COMPOSITION: Copy of your own composition for the adjudicator is encouraged but not required.
- 13. Participants are encouraged to complete their selection in 5 minutes.
- 14. <u>GRADE QUALIFYING INFORMATION FOR DUETS AND TRIOS</u>: A participant may **move up** or down one level in a duet or trio. This enables more participants to take part in the festival.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR WIND AND PERCUSSION (Please note: Memorization not required)

- 1. Please number bars for the adjudicator.
- 2. In own choice classes, participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music or proof of electronic purchase before that particular class. If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of a large envelope, place music inside and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicator are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 5. Participant can enter only once in any one class.
- 6. In own choice classes, participants are urged to use live accompaniment, if possible.
- 7. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.
- 8. QUICK STUDY PICK UP: Participant needs to be registered in at least one other wind class. Participant needs to pick up music from the adjudicator the day before scheduled class or make arrangements for music to be emailed. Participant is expected to learn the selection independently.
- 9. Please try to complete your selection in 5 minutes.
- 10. OWN COMPOSITION: Copy of your own composition for the adjudicator is encouraged but not required.
- 11.<u>Instrumentalists</u>: Long performances require additional scheduling consideration. Please contact registrant for fee structure based on length of performance. (Solos \$5-\$15. Duets \$8-\$15)
- 12. <u>GRADE QUALIFYING INFORMATION FOR DUETS AND TRIOS</u>: A participant may **move up** or down one level in a duet or trio. This enables more participants to take part in the festival.
- 13. QUICK STUDY PICK UP: Participant needs to be registered in at least one other wind/percussion class. Participant needs to pick up music from the adjudicator the day before scheduled class or make arrangements for music to be emailed. Participant is expected to learn the selection independently.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR FIDDLE (Please note: Memorization not required)

- 1. Please number bars for the adjudicator.
- Participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy or provide proof of electronic purchase of the music before that particular class. If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of a large envelope, place music inside and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicators are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Solo participants must play a Waltz, Jig and Reel in that order, <u>except</u> First year of fiddle instruction participants who are required to play only <u>one</u> tune (Waltz <u>or</u> Jig <u>or</u> Reel).
- 5. Duet participants play <u>one</u> selection of own choice. (Note change from previous years)
- 6. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.
- 7. Participants provide their own accompanist.
- 8. In case of accident (e.g. broken string or power failure) beyond participant's control, replay will be allowed.
- 9. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 10. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed
- 12. OWN COMPOSITION: Copy of your own composition for the adjudicator is encouraged but not

required.

13. <u>GRADE QUALIFYING INFORMATION FOR DUETS AND TRIOS</u>: A participant may **move up** or down one level in a duet or trio. This enables more participants to take part in the festival.

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14. QUICK STUDY PICK UP: Participant needs to be registered in at least one other fiddle class. Participant needs to pick up music from the adjudicator the day before scheduled class or make arrangements for music to be emailed. Participant is expected to learn the selection independently.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR VIOLIN (Please note: Memorization not required)

- 1. Please number bars for the adjudicator.
- Participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music or provide proof of electronic purchase before that particular class.
 If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of a large envelope, place music inside and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicators are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Participants provide their own accompanist.
- 5. <u>Solo and duet</u> participants play <u>one</u> selection of own choice. (Note change from previous years)
- 6. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.
- 7. In case of accident (eg. broken string or power failure) beyond participant's control, replay will be allowed.
- 8. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 9. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.
- 10. OWN COMPOSITION: Copy of your own composition for the adjudicator is encouraged but not required.

 NB: If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of a large envelope, place
 music inside and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicators are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.
- 5. <u>Solo and duet participants play one selection of own choice.</u> (Note change from previous years)
- 6. In case of accident (eg. broken string or power failure) beyond participant's control, replay will be allowed.
- 7. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 8. Accompaniment is optional.
- 9. Amplification must be provided by the participant.
- 10. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.
- 11. OWN COMPOSITION: Copy of your own composition for the adjudicator is encouraged but not required.
- 12. <u>GRADE QUALIFYING INFORMATION FOR DUETS AND TRIOS</u>: A participant may **move up** or down one level in a duet or trio. This enables more participants to take part in the festival.
- **13.** QUICK STUDY PICK UP: Participant needs to be registered in at least one other guitar class. Participant needs to pick up music from the adjudicator the day before scheduled class or make arrangements for music to be emailed. Participant is expected to learn the selection independently.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR BAND (Please note: Memorization not required)

1. Please number bars for the adjudicator.

- Participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music or proof
 of electronic purchase before that particular class.
 If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of envelope, place music inside
 and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicators are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Please perform two contrasting selections.
- 5. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 6. Bands are requested to keep their warmup selections to five 5 minutes.
- 7. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.

RULES and REGULATIONS for VOCALS

- 1. Please number bars for the adjudicator.
- In own choice classes, participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music or proof of electronic purchase before that particular class. Decisions of the adjudicators are final and should not be questioned. When providing electronic copy, place unfolded music in large envelope, staple proof of purchase to outside of envelope, ready for presentation to adjudicator. Copyright requirements must be met.
- 3. Decisions of the adjudicator are final and should not be questioned.
- 4. Vocal selections <u>must</u> be memorized, except the self-accompanied class. Failure to do so, in competitive classes, will result in the participant(s) being adjudicated, but not receiving a mark.
- 5. Participants in vocal classes must sing at least two verses of the selection. See each class for specific rules.
- 6. Participants understand that any own choice selection may be performed in only one class.
- 7. Classroom classes for all Gr.'s will be non-competitive unless otherwise stated. See syllabus for accompaniment rules.
- 8. Elementary vocal ensembles are to be performed a cappella and without a conductor. See specific class for size.
- 9. Vocal selections may be transposed to suit vocal range of the participant(s).
- 10. In own choice classes, please note specific rules re accompaniment.
- 11. <u>Graded vocal sight singing classes</u> may be performed <u>only</u> for the <u>adjudicator</u> separate from the audience.
- 12. Primary and Junior Contemporary groups require a group name.
- 13. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.
- 14. 'Own choice' songs must be compatible with the participant(s)' age and voice.
- 15. A cappella is singing without accompaniment. Selection must be memorized. Starting pitch may be given. Please note: A cappella singing may be performed in other classes.
- TRIPLE SENSATION CLASSES. Triple Sensation classes are multi-disciplinary performances based on your song choice. Please include three distinct elements. Singing must be one of the elements. The other options may include movement/dancing, drama/acting and speaking.
- 17. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.
- KARAOKE Two classes offered (See Vocal and Adult/Cross Generational). Non-competitive, no awards. Fee applies. Adjudication given. You must provide/operate your own machine/equipment. Unlimited number of participants. <u>Do not do Karaoke in any other classes</u>. NB: Group Name needed

WHISTLING

- 1. Accompaniment is optional.
- 2. If music is available, please provide it to the adjudicator.
- 3. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.

ADULT/CROSS GENERATIONAL: (non-competitive) NB: Fee schedule applies to this class

In <u>each</u> of these adult/cross generational non-competitive classes, participants are welcome to enter <u>more</u> than once.

1. This class encourages families/groups/ participants of all ages and abilities to take part.

- 2. A participant may, in order to accommodate participation by others, perform more than once in any of the adult/cross generational classes.
- Participants must provide the adjudicator with an original (not photocopied) copy of the music (with bars numbered) or proof of electronic purchase before performing.
 If providing electronic copy, staple proof of purchase to the outside of the envelope, place music inside and have ready for presentation to the adjudicator.
- 4. The fee schedule applies to this class.
- 5. When time permits, one adult/cross generational entry is invited to perform at the Concert of Stars.
- 6. Due to Canada's Privacy and Copyright laws, unauthorized videotaping/transmission of performances during any part of the Festival is not allowed.
- 7. Participants are encouraged to complete their performance in 5 minutes.
- KARAOKE: Non-competitive, no awards. Fee applies. Adjudication given. You must provide/operate your own machine/equipment. Unlimited number of participants. <u>Do not do Karaoke in any other classes</u>. NB: Group Name needed

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR ORAL SPEAKING/DRAMA

- 1. Oral speaking could also be called 'choral speaking'; therefore, this is a spoken performance.
- 2. Perform a selection (poem or prose) of your own choosing, original or own creation.
- 3. The selection must be memorized (cue cards are allowed).
- 4. Please try to complete performance within 5 minutes.
- 5. Gestures, costumes, and props are optional.
- 6. Please choose age and audience appropriate selections.
- 7. Consider libraries as a reference.

Our Novice division provides a supportive performance space for dancers who are new to competitive dancing. It is exclusively for dancers without prior competitive stage experience;

dancers with previous competition experience are not eligible.

+++Class D-1 Novice solos: Dancer has never competed in a solo.

+++Class D-2 Novice duets/trios: All dancers must be 100% novice, having never competed in a solo, duet or trio.

Routine must portray a character through dance/movement and costume while telling a story. Lip synching and any form of dance are permitted. If dancers are singing for 50% or more of their performance, they must be in the Song & Dance category.
